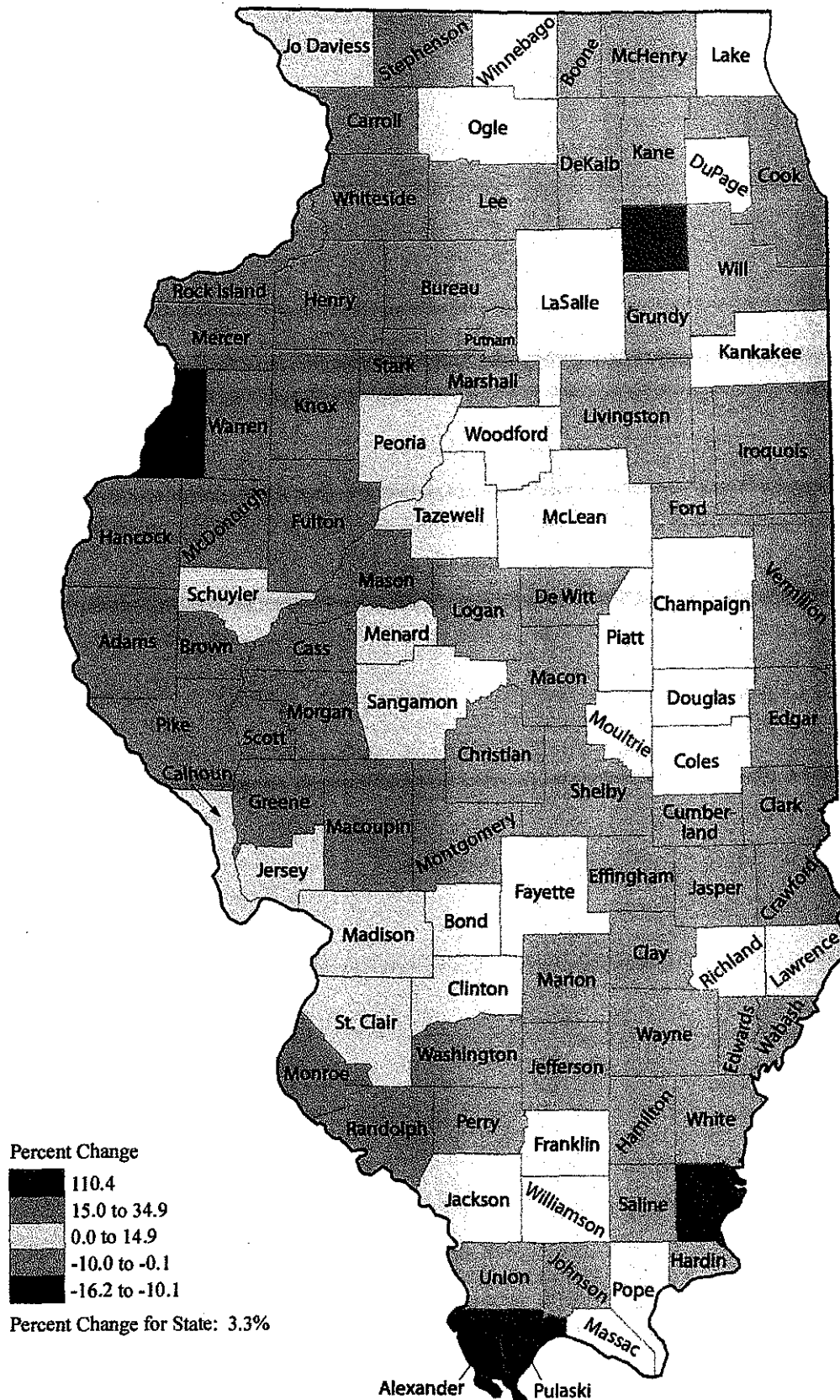

Illinois Population Up 3.3 Percent in 2010 Census

Illinois Remains 5th Largest State in Nation

CHICAGO – Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO) Director Warren Ribley today announced results of the 2010 census for the state of Illinois. According to the data, over 12.8 million (12,830,632) people live in Illinois, up 3.3 percent since 2000. The 2010 Census represented the most massive participation movement ever in the country with 74 percent of households voluntarily returning their census forms by mail. Illinois had a 76 percent participation rate, above the national average.

“The Census is an important tool to ensure communities of every size get their fair share of funding for vital services and programs, and to provide accurate data to plan for the future,” said Director Ribley. “Thanks to our collaboration with community organizations throughout the state, this year’s census yielded one of the largest response rates ever.”

The top five counties in Illinois based on population are: Cook, DuPage, Lake, Will, and Kane. The five largest cities are Chicago (2,695,598), Aurora (197,899), Rockford (152,871), Joliet (147,433), and Naperville (141,853), with Springfield (116,250), Peoria (115,007), Champaign (81,055), Bloomington (76,610) and Decatur (76,122) having the largest populations downstate.

Cook County continues to have the highest population in the state with nearly 5.2 million residents (5,194,675), a decrease of 3.4 percent. This includes approximately 2.7 million residents in the City of Chicago, which saw a 6.9 percent decrease from 2000.

Illinois has seen an increase in minorities in the state over the last decade. Asians experienced the largest increase - 163,331 residents since 2000, a 38.6 percent increase. People reporting two or more races on their census form increased by 54,966 or 23.4 percent. People reporting Hispanic or Latino origin increased by nearly 500,000 residents, or 32.5 percent. The voting age population in Illinois, people 18 years and over, increased by over 500,000 residents, or 5.8 percent.

The U.S. Census Bureau conducts the census every 10 years, as required by the U.S. Constitution. Census questionnaires were mailed or delivered to every household in the United States beginning in early 2010. In December 2010, apportionment data was announced; this information is used to determine the number of Congressional seats each state receives.

The data received today, known as the redistricting data, will allow state officials to realign congressional and state legislative districts as part of the redistricting process, taking into account population shifts since the last census and assuring equal representation for their constituents.

Count Question Resolution

The U.S. Census Bureau partnered with state, local and tribal governments across the nation to help ensure a complete and accurate count in the 2010 Census. While the Census Bureau's goal was to count everyone once, only once, and in the right place, there are historically a small percentage of cases where a wrong geographic boundary or coding of a housing unit was used to produce the official census population and housing counts for a local area. There may also be cases where due to processing errors, the Census Bureau mistakenly duplicated or deleted living quarters that were identified during the census.

In all these instances, the Census Bureau has established a process by which elected officials may challenge their jurisdiction's 2010 Census count — it's called Count Question Resolution. The program was created to specifically address three types of instances where a state, local or tribal government feels an error was made in the 2010 Census results for their area.



Count Question Resolution will accept challenge submissions from governmental units beginning June 1, 2011. All challenges must be received by the Census Bureau no later than June 1, 2013. It is important to note that the Census Bureau will not collect any additional data or conduct additional surveys during this challenge process.

If a challenge results in a change, the Census Bureau will issue official revised counts to the affected governments. These changes can be used by the governments for future programs that require official 2010 Census data. They will also be used to calculate subsequent population estimates for that community.

Following the 2000 Census, potential count problems were identified for 1,180 out of 39,000 jurisdictions — less than 3 percent of all governmental jurisdictions across the nation. The final 2000 CQR corrections resulted in a net gain in population of about 2,700 people. This amounts to about 1/1000th of one percent of the nation's population of 281 million people counted in the 2000 Census.
